






How could you photograph the sounds and things that you hear in a photograph? Although photographs are visual and often based on how they look rather than how they sound, it is possible to incorporate an element of sound into a photograph.


Video is an option here, but a sense of sound can also be achieved with a still image. In a photograph of a group of children playing, you can often 'hear' them chattering away, and in a photograph of trees blowing in the wind, you can often 'hear' the sound of the leaves rustling as they move, or fireworks as they crackle in the sky.




Sounds in nature & the environment
