- 1) Complete <u>ALL</u> revision tasks for the topics covered so far, set on Seneca Learning by your class teacher.
- 2) Revise the course content (all topics covered can be found on Seneca) using your exercise book, revision guides, the text book, and the resources suggested below. Use your Personal Learning Checklists to keep track of your revision. Take notes, make mind-maps, and engage actively in your revision process.

- 4) Visit the Edexcel Business Studies website and complete as many past paper questions on Theme 1 and Theme 2 topics as you can. Use the mark schemes to guide your process. Complete questions under exam conditions using the essay structures elicited in class a copy of the suggested essay structures documents has been attached with this assignment for your reference / printing. - 5) After completing past paper questions (ideally in timed conditions!), **consult the Examiner's Report for that paper and year**.
