ATTENDANCE

There are only 190 school days in the year and students need to ensure they utilise these fully to offer them the best opportunity for future success. Fulston Manor is committed to working with parents and carers to ensure as high a level of school attendance as possible and, as we are sure you will appreciate, where attendance falls below 100%, this impacts on a student's ability to achieve their potential and becomes a cause for concern.

There is a clear link between good attendance and academic outcomes. Government research indicates a significant negative link between absence and attainment, with every day missed associated with lower attainment outcomes.

At Fulston Manor School we expect students to have 100% attendance and, at a minimum, to meet 95%.

MEDICAL APPOINTMENTS

We ask parents and carers to try, wherever possible, to arrange Doctor/Dentist and other appointments outside of school hours. If this is not possible, then students should not take the whole day off and should attend school around the appointment time.

IN-TERM HOLIDAYS

No holidays are authorised during term time. It is your duty to inform us if you have booked a holiday.

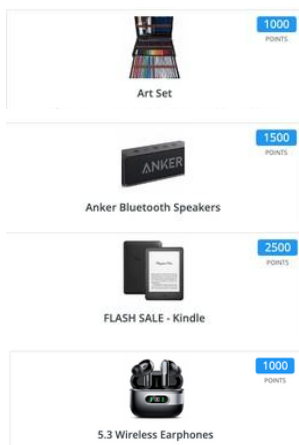
COMMUNITY CARDS

Every term, your child will be issued with a Community Card.

If they fill the positive side of their Community Card by demonstrating any of our Fulston Family Values, they will be awarded 10 positive points on ClassCharts – these can be spent in our Reward Store!

Alternatively, if they do not follow our basic expectations outlined on our Community Card, staff will sign their card – if they receive five negative signatures, they will receive a House detention.

REWARDS STORE



Our ClassCharts Rewards Store is one of the many perks of being a member of our Fulston Family.

Positive points are awarded for a wide range of things, from demonstrating our Fulston Family Values, completing great classwork or homework and being a great ambassador for our community.

Positive points can be spent in our Rewards Store on a huge variety of prizes such as cinema tickets, PlayStation or Xbox vouchers, Amazon and other shopping vouchers or sweets and chocolates.

Some students are saving up their points to buy some of our top prizes like Wireless Earphones, Hair Straighteners, Kindle, Bluetooth speakers or Amazon Fire HD 10 Tablet.

MOBILE PHONES

Mobile phones and headphones/earphones/AirPods are **not permitted** during the school day.

Students must switch off their mobile phones at the school gate; it must be **stored securely** and must remain there until the end of the school day.

STUDY SUPPORT CLUB

Our Study Support Club meet every day after school, from 3:15 p.m. to 4:15 p.m. in our Library.

You do not need to sign up, you can just simply turn up if you have some homework or revision that you would like to complete.

We have fully trained staff on hand and you can use all of our library resources, including the computers, to complete your work.

OUR BESPOKE PEER MENTORING SYSTEM



At Fulston Manor School, we have our very own bespoke and award-winning Peer Mentoring System, whereby specially trained students and staff are on hand to help you with any challenges you may face.

Students can speak with their Head of House who can organize for you to have a Peer Mentor. Mrs Woollcott will then allocate a Peer Mentor to you.

FULSTON FAMILY UNIFORM

- Black blazer with school badge.
- Grey V-neck jumper (optional).
- White shirt/blouse – short or long sleeved
- House tie.
- Checked grey and black skirt - worn with waistband showing
or
Black straight-legged tailored school trousers.
- Socks - plain white, grey or black. No trainer socks - no logos.
- Tights – black, minimum 40 denier.
- Shoes should be black, plain and sensible. For obvious safety reasons, thin or higher heels are inappropriate. Shoes should be suitable for both indoor and outdoor use. Boots, trainers, canvas or other highly coloured shoes **must not be worn** in school.
- Non-discreet make-up, acrylic nails, nail varnish or jewellery should **NOT** be worn to school, with the exception of below.
- One small discrete pair of gold/silver ear studs (one stud per ear lobe) are allowed – these must be removed for PE/Games and at other times as requested, for a health and safety reason. No other piercings are allowed.
- All extremes of hairstyling are not permitted, including any unnatural colours.

PE AND GAMES KIT

- Black sport polo shirt with House colour logo.
- Black ¼-zip mid-layer top with school logo (optional).
- Plain black sport shorts (no logos) **or** plain black running shorts (two-layer shorts) (no logos)
or plain black running leggings (no logos).
- Sport socks.
- All students should wear trainers for PE/Games.
- All students should have shin pads for Games.
- Football boots and gum shields should be purchased separately for games.

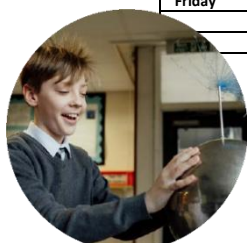

TRAVELLING TO AND FROM SCHOOL

Whether you live in walking distance from school, or you plan to catch the bus or even train each day, we recommend practising your journey to and from school a few times over the summer – particularly if you are not used to walking to school or getting on public transport.

Here are a few things you should familiarise yourself with:

- The location and name of the bus stop or train station you will use to get to and from school.
- What time and number train or bus you will need to catch each day, as well as the next bus or train that you can catch if you miss your usual one. How to read the timetable for your bus or train company and what other routes you could take if there is an issue with your normal journey.
- What you should do if you do miss your bus or train - we recommend planning this with your family so that everyone is aware of your plan.
- If you are going to walk to school, perhaps familiarise yourself with a few different routes.
- If you are travelling to and from school with friends, make sure you plan a clear meeting spot where you can wait for and meet your friends each day.

The purpose of the Summer School is to support your child's smooth transition to Fulston Manor School. During the session, students will have the opportunity to:

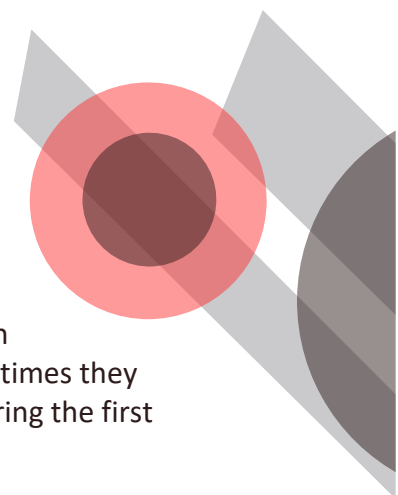
- Explore and familiarise themselves with their new surroundings

FAQ's



HOW WILL MY CHILD RECEIVE THEIR TRAVEL PASS?

If you have applied for travel pass through Kent County Council Travel, your child can collect this during their first week of school. Passes are sent directly to us, but sometimes they do arrive late. Your child may need to carry a small amount of money with them during the first week, if their pass has not arrived.

WHAT IF MY CHILD FEELS UNWELL AT SCHOOL?

If they are in a lesson, they should tell the teacher that they are feeling unwell. If they are not in a lesson, tell a member of their House Pastoral Team.

WILL MY CHILD HAVE THEIR OWN LOCKER?

Yes – your child will be allocated a locker within their House area. They will not be allowed to carry their school bag or coat with them around the school site and these, along with books and any equipment they need each day, should be stored in their locker. It is your responsibility to provide a padlock for your child's locker and we recommend you give a spare key or the code to your House Pastoral Team.

ARE THERE ANY AFTER-SCHOOL CLUBS OR ACTIVITIES THAT MY CHILD CAN JOIN?

100% YES. Our extensive After-School Clubs and Activities programme is full of fantastic opportunities to take part in before school, at lunchtime and after school each day. You do not need to sign up for most of our clubs and regular timetables are published in Tutor Rooms, House areas, on our website and on our social media channels each term.

WHAT SHOULD I DO IF MY CHILD HAS LOST SOMETHING AT SCHOOL?

We recommend that you ask your child to retrace their steps; more often than not items are left in classrooms and are found. If your child still cannot find what they are looking for, speak to your House Pastoral Team.

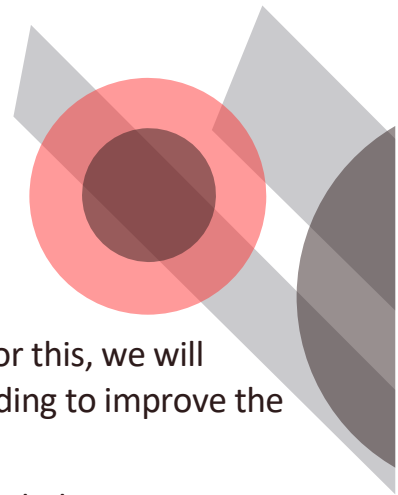
SHOULD MY CHILD TAKE ANY MONEY TO SCHOOL WITH THEM?

All catering is cashless and you can top up their account online. If they do need to carry money for travel, we suggest you keep this as little as possible and only take in the amount they need to cover travel costs.

WHAT SHOULD MY CHILD DO IF THEY ARE LATE TO SCHOOL?

Arriving on time (8:40 a.m. each morning) is really important. However, if your child is a little late, they need to ensure that they have been signed in so that we know they are on site and safe. If they arrive before 9:10 a.m., they should head straight to their Tutor Room and their Tutor will sign them in. If they arrive after 9:10 a.m., they will need to sign in at School Reception.

FREE SCHOOL MEALS AND PUPIL PREMIUM



Your child may be eligible for Free School Meals and, if you register them for this, we will receive extra funding known as Pupil Premium. We use this additional funding to improve the educational provision at the school.

All children in households who are in receipt of **Universal Credit** will be entitled to receive a Free School Meal.

Please note, if your child already receives Free School Meals, you do not need to re-register your child or take any further action.

Is my child eligible for Free School Meals?

Your child would be eligible if you access:

- Universal Credit – if you apply on or after 1st April 2018, your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get).
- Support under Part Six of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999.

Your child may also be entitled to Free School Meals if your household is in receipt of:

- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance.
- The guarantee element of Pension Credit.

Does my child have to eat the Free School Meals

No. However, if you are eligible but you want your child to have packed lunch, I would still encourage you to register, because the school will receive the funding – which can support your child in other ways.

How do I register?

Our cashless catering system handles payment for school meals without anyone being aware of who is getting a free meal and who is paying.

What other support is available?

Fulston Manor School works closely with the Sittingbourne Food Bank.
